

The History Center

A new video featuring Esley Hamilton, St. Louis County Historian, will be released soon. Coinciding with the opening of the Clayton Neighborhoods Historic Exhibition in the History Center located at the renovated Center of Clayton, the video will tell unique stories of several key neighborhoods that make up our community.

Shaw Park All-Season Recreation Complex

CCF is still seeking additional funding to complete this project that transforms the former Ice Rink into a yearround recreational facility for all ages. The existing ice rink opened in 1961 and, while it has served the community well over these past 55 years, it is long past the life expectancy for a facility of this type. Chiodini Architects was selected in the summer of 2019 to design the project and is joined by SM Wilson as the construction manager. The facility will serve as an outdoor ice rink in the winter and a field for recreational activites and special events for the remainder of the year. There are many ways to contribute. Maryland Park

Located at 7811 Maryland Avenue next to the Mid-County Library, Maryland Park will become Clayton's twelfth public park.
